Critical Thinking and Team Alignment for Better Decisions.

Make better decisions as a team. Participants find the flaws in their own thinking, establish a clear aim, and fix the way their team decides today.

Format
Two days. In person or live virtual.

What it is for.

A team's decisions affect the whole business, yet most teams never look at how they decide. Meetings run without a clear aim, the same thinking traps repeat, and nobody is sure who will act. Analysis is now quick and cheap to produce, including by AI tools, which makes the judgment a team applies to it the part that counts.

Through a series of tasks participants uncover their own flaws as critical thinkers. They practice establishing clarity of aim and using it to align others, apply tools for decision meetings and check-ins, and work with a framework for problem solving and decision making that brings out the interdependencies an action needs. They then work through their team's present decision-making problems and leave with a team action plan.

What you leave with.

- Clarity of aim: how to establish it and align others around it
- Awareness of the flaws in your own thinking, and ways to correct them
- The ability to run effective decision meetings and check-ins
- A framework for giving team members feedback on performance
- A framework for problem solving and decision making
- A team action plan for the decision-making problems you have now

Why it matters.

- Decisions improve when the team sees its own thinking traps
- Alignment with the organization's goals makes accountability possible
- When analysis is instant, the quality of a decision rests on the judgment applied to it
