Innovation and Problem Solving.

Solve problems with a six-step method and look past the obvious answer. Participants leave with tools for each step and a way to defend their solution to decision makers.

What it is for.

Solving a problem starts with a clear view of two things: the reality you want to create and the situation you have now. Most teams jump to the first workable answer and miss the better one.

Participants apply a six-step approach to problem solving and use a set of tools at each step. The workshop then turns to innovation: strategies for going beyond the obvious, and an idea analysis framework for testing big ideas, the kind that could solve the problem and also put the organization ahead of its competition.

- A structured framework for solving problems and keeping them solved
- A way to solve problems across functions that reduces conflict and draws on skills outside your team
- Tools and techniques for each step of the process
- An approach to innovation that leads to more creative solutions
- A communication framework for presenting and defending your solution to decision makers
